

Downtown Denver employees help spread a little love

People Spread Love is an group based in Jackson Hole, WY that reaches out to individuals around the world who simply need encouragement.

They provide names and ideas to those in their world-wide network so they can “share love” through handwritten notes, cards, letters, or drawings.

One care package sent to a Denver recipient didn't have the proper address, but the combined team of Downtown Station Customer Service Managers Star Andrews and Angel Dinges, along with Retail Associate Leon Robinson helped complete the circle of gratitude.

“We were trying tracking down a package that was addressed incorrectly,” said People Spread Love Founder Heather DeVine. “Star, Angel and Leon were so helpful. They located it and were able to redirect it.”

The package of encouraging notes was sent to a woman in the Denver area who just lost her husband of 50 years, “and she needed encouragement,” said DeVine. “Their efforts meant a lot to us.”

The organization then decided to send their own package of encouragement to the Denver employees.

“We were very surprised – and touched when we got it,” said Andrews. “Now we want to spread the cheer we received today.”

According to DeVine, this isn't the first time they've reached out to postal employees. They regularly hold signs outside the busy Jackson Hole Post Office – not of protest, but of encouragement and thanks.

“They work very hard and don't get often get much thanks,” said DeVine. “We are hoping to change that.”
